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HOP STOCKS - UNITED STATES

The inventory of hops held by growers, dealers, and brewers on September 1, 2009 totaled 65.0 million pounds, a 38 percent increase from September 1, 2008 stocks. This is the highest inventory reported as of September 1 since 2003, when stocks were 69.0 million pounds.

Stocks held by brewers, at 40.0 million pounds, were up 38 percent from a year ago. Stocks held by dealers and growers on September 1, 2009 were 25.0 million pounds, up 39 percent from the stocks on hand last year.

POULTRY

Washington's egg production totaled 141 million during August 2009, 15 million more than in August 2008. All layers in Washington during August 2009 averaged 6.1 million, up 11 percent from a year ago. Six percent of the layers were being molted as of September 1, 2009, while 34.0 percent of all the layers had completed at least one molting in their lifetime. U.S. egg production totaled 7.59 billion during August 2009, up 1 percent from last year. Production included 6.51 billion table eggs and 1.08 billion hatching eggs, of which 1.00 billion were broiler-type and 72 million were egg-type. The total number of layers during August 2009 averaged 332 million, down 1 percent from last year. August egg production per 100 layers was 2,284 eggs, up 1 percent from August 2008. All layers in the United States on September 1, 2009 totaled 333 million, down 1 percent

WASHINGTON POTATOES

The final value of Washington's 2008 potato crop was \$692.9 million, 3 percent higher than the 2007 crop of \$675.4 million. The 2008 market year average price received by Washington growers of \$7.45 per cwt. was 75 cents above the 2007 average price of \$6.70. Processors in Washington and Oregon (excluding Malheur County) used a total of 81.3 million cwt. of 2008 crop potatoes compared with 82.8 million cwt. used in 2007 and 77.4 million cwt. used in 2006. Of the total potatoes processed in the Nation, Washington and other Oregon processors accounted for 39.9 percent.

COLD STORAGE

Total fresh apples in storage for the United States on August 31, 2009 totaled 141.2 million pounds, which was an increase of 22 percent from the amount in storage a year ago. Frozen French fries in storage for the three Pacific Coast states and eight Mountain states on August 31, 2009, totaled 601.1 million pounds, and accounted for 67 percent of the Nation's French fries in storage. Total potatoes in storage for the three Pacific Coast states and eight Mountain states on August 31, 2009, totaled 713.1 million pounds, which was 64 percent of the Nation's total potatoes in storage.
